# **Information for Prayer Dealing with Witchcraft**

The following are scriptures concerning dealing with witchcraft, wicca etc. it gives us what the Word of God has to say about such things and what God intends to do to those who practice these things and how to pray concerning the things we will be dealing with on Oct 31, 2009

(Note: OT:# & NT:# refers to Strong's Concordance & Lexicon Number System, as a point of reference)

#### WITCHCRAFT

**1 Sam 15:23-24** 23 For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the Lord, he hath also rejected thee from being king.

- OT:H4805 meriy (mer-ee'); from OT:4784; bitterness, i.e. (figuratively) rebellion; concretely, bitter, or rebellious: KJV bitter, (most) rebel (-lion, -lious).
- OT:7081 qecem (keh'-sem); from OT:7080; a lot: also divination (including its fee), oracle: KJV (reward of) divination, divine sentence, witchcraft.
- OT:7080 qacam (kaw-sam'); a primitive root; properly, to distribute, i.e. determine by lot or magical scroll; by implication, to divine: KJV divine (-r, -ation), prudent, soothsayer, use [divination].
- OT:6484 patsar (paw-tsar'); a primitive root; to peck at, i.e. (figuratively) stun or dull: KJV press, urge, stubbornness.

**2 Chron 33:6** And he caused his children to pass through the fire in the valley of the son of Hinnom: also he observed times, and used enchantments, and used witchcraft, and dealt with a familiar spirit, and with wizards: he wrought much evil in the sight of the Lord, to provoke him to anger.

- OT:178 'owb (obe); from the same as OT:1 (apparently through the idea of prattling a father's name); properly, a mumble, i.e. a water skin (from its hollow sound); hence a necromancer (ventriloquist, as from a jar): KJV bottle, familiar spirit.
- OT:3049 yidde`oniy (yid-deh-o-nee'); from OT:3045; properly, a knowing one; specifically, a conjurer; (by impl) a ghost: KJV wizard.
- OT:3784 kashaph (kaw-shaf'); a primitive root; properly, to whisper a spell, i.e. to inchant or practise magic: KJV sorcerer, (use) witch (-craft).
- OT:3785 kesheph (keh'-shef); from OT:3784; magic: KJV sorcery, witchcraft.
- OT:5172 nachash (naw-khash'); a primitive root; properly, to hiss, i.e. whisper a (magic) spell; generally, to prognosticate: KJV certainly, divine, enchanter, (use) enchantment, learn by experience, indeed, diligently observe.
- OT:5173 nachash (nakh'-ash); from OT:5172; an incantation or augury: KJV enchantment.
- OT:6049 `anan (aw-nan'); a primitive root; to cover; used only as a denominative from OT:6051, to cloud over; figuratively, to act covertly, i.e. practise magic: KJV bring, enchanter, Meonemin, observe (-r of) times, soothsayer, sorcerer.

**Gal 5:19-21** - Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, 20 Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, 21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I

tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God SORCERY –

Acts 8:9-12 - But there was a certain man, called Simon, which beforetime in the same city used sorcery, and bewitched the people of Samaria, giving out that himself was some great one: To whom they all gave heed, from the least to the greatest, saying, This man is the great power of God. And to him they had regard, because that of long time he had bewitched them with sorceries.

- NT:3098 T:3095 mageia (mag-i'-ah); from NT:3096; "magic": KJV sorcery.
- NT:3096 mageuo (mag-yoo'-o); from NT:3097; to practice magic: KJV use sorcery.
- NT:3097 magos (mag'-os); of foreign origin [OT:7248]; a Magian, i.e. Oriental scientist; by implication a magician: KJV sorcerer, wise man.

**Mal 3:5** - 5 And I will come near to you to judgment; and I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, and against the adulterers, and against false swearers, and against those that oppress the hireling in his wages, the widow, and the fatherless, and that turn aside the stranger from his right, and fear not me, saith the Lord of hosts.

• OT:5749 `uwd (ood); a primitive root; to duplicate or repeat; by implication, to protest, testify (as by reiteration); intensively, to encompass, restore (as a sort of reduplication): KJV - admonish, charge, earnestly, lift up, protest, call (take) to record, relieve, rob, solemnly, stand upright, testify, give warning, (bear, call to, give, take to) witness.

The Lord himself will witness against the sorcerers and he will do it quickly.

#### **MAGIC**

Isa 47:12-14 - keep on, then, with your magic spells and with your many sorceries, which you have labored at since childhood. Perhaps you will succeed, perhaps you will cause terror. 13 All the counsel you have received has only worn you out! Let your astrologers come forward, those stargazers who make predictions month by month, let them save you from what is coming upon you. 14 Surely they are like stubble; the fire will burn them up. They cannot even save themselves from the power of the flame. Here are no coals to warm anyone; there is no fire to sit by.

### **Enchantments**

• OT:2267 cheber (kheh'-ber); from OT:2266; a society; also a spell: KJV - charmer (-ing), company, enchantment, wide.

# Stargazers -

• OT:2374 chozeh (kho-zeh'); active participle of OT:2372; a beholder in vision; also a compact (as looked upon with approval): KJV - agreement, prophet, see that, seer, [star-] gazer.

# Astrologer -

• OT:1895 habar (haw-bar'); a primitive root of uncertain (perhaps foreign) derivation; to be a horoscopist: KJV - (astro-) loger. prognosticator -

• OT:3045 yada` (yaw-dah'); a primitive root; to know (properly, to ascertain by seeing); used in a great variety of senses, figuratively, literally, euphemistically and inferentially (including observation, care, recognition; and causatively, instruction, designation, punishment, etc.) [as follow]: KJV - acknowledge, acquaintance (-ted with), advise, answer, appoint, assuredly, be aware, [un-] awares, can [-not], certainly, comprehend, consider, could they, cunning, declare, be diligent, (can, cause to) discern, discover, endued with, familiar friend, famous, feel, can have, be [ig-] norant, instruct, kinsfolk, kinsman, (cause to let, make) know, (come to give, have, take) knowledge, have [knowledge], (be, make, make to be, makeself) known, be learned, lie by man, mark, perceive, privy to, prognosticator, regard, have respect, skilful, shew, can (man of) skill, be sure, of a surety, teach, (can) tell, understand, have [understanding], will be, wist, wit, wot.

Ezek 13:17-22 - 17 "Now, son of man, set your face against the daughters of your people who prophesy out of their own imagination. Prophesy against them 18 and say, 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: Woe to the women who sew magic charms on all their wrists and make veils of various lengths for their heads in order to ensnare people. Will you ensnare the lives of my people but preserve your own? 19 You have profaned me among my people for a few handfuls of barley and scraps of bread. By lying to my people, who listen to lies, you have killed those who should not have died and have spared those who should not live. 20 "'Therefore this is what the Sovereign Lord says: I am against your magic charms with which you ensnare people like birds and I will tear them from your arms; I will set free the people that you ensnare like birds. 21 I will tear off your veils and save my people from your hands, and they will no longer fall prey to your power. Then you will know that I am the Lord.

Acts 19:19-20 - Also, many of those who had practiced magic brought their books together and burned them in the sight of all. And they counted up the value of them, and it totaled fifty thousand pieces of silver. 20 So the word of the Lord grew mightily and prevailed.

• NT:4021 - periergos (per-ee'-er-gos); from NT:4012 and NT:2041; working all around, i.e. officious (meddlesome, neuter plural magic): KJV - busybody, curious arts.

## **DIVINATION**

Lev 19:26 - 'Do not practice divination or sorcery

• OT:6049 - `anan (aw-nan'); a primitive root; to cover; used only as a denominative from OT:6051, to cloud over; figuratively, to act covertly, i.e. practise magic KJV - bring, enchanter, Meonemin, observe (-r of) times, soothsayer, sorcerer.

**Acts 16:16-18** - 16 Now it happened, as we went to prayer, that a certain slave girl possessed with a spirit of divination met us, who brought her masters much profit by fortune-telling. 17 This girl followed Paul and us, and cried out, saying, "These men are the servants of the Most High God, who proclaim to us the way of salvation." 18 And this she did for many days.

• NT:4437 - Puthon (poo'-thone); from Putho (the name of the region where Delphi, the seat of the famous oracle, was located); a Python, i.e. (by analogy, with the supposed diviner there) inspiration (soothsaying): KJV - divination.
